



The Outdoor season finished on September 16/17th with a very successful finals weekend, where a full programme was held with10 finals, 9 played on the Saturday and 1 on the Sunday. The finals were fiercely fought, entertaining the crowd that had turned up to support and enjoy a drink in the warm sunshine. Well done to all those that made the finals and we look forward to presenting you with the awards on Presentation evening in December.

The Club's Indoor season is well under way with eight new teams entering various leagues. Around a dozen bowlers who started their coaching sessions last year are now playing regularly in the leagues. The Club runs internal leagues for Morning Triples, Evening Triples, Aussie Pairs and this season has seen the introduction of the Yard Stick Triples league, which is proving to be popular, particularly with newer members.

The Wednesday evening coaching sessions have seen twelve new people trying out the sport so far and they are developing their skills at a fast rate. Although the Bowls Drive has been dropped some members organise themselves into teams for friendly games after the coaching session.

As a reminder coaching is provided each Wednesday 6.00 p.m. - 7.00 p.m. followed at 7.15 p.m. by 'friendly games'. Any one interested in taking up the sport of bowls is offered their first five coaching sessions free of charge. Following this, new members can join as a Social / Beginner at a cost of £18.

This season has also seen the West Row Darts team playing their games in the Indoor building.

The changes to the indoor building have progressed well and the Indoor season started on 11<sup>th</sup>. September, as planned. The installation of a new kitchen has been virtually the last piece in the jigsaw.

# AROUND THE ALLOTMENTS IN NOVEMBER & DECEMBER



We hope everyone has enjoyed the lovely warm weather that we've had in September and October (at least it has been at the time of writing). This has encouraged a small flourish of soft fruits such as strawberries and autumn raspberries with enough left over to make a few pots of homemade jam.



The nights are drawing in fast now and the shortest day is coming up on 21<sup>st</sup> December. This means that available working time on the allotment is reduced but it is still a good time to have a general clear up, clean tools and equipment and to turn over the soil ready for the new growing year.

Bare-root fruit trees such as apple, pear and cherry can be set in November along with fruits such as raspberry and gooseberry. This gives them the chance to have a full growing season when temperatures start to rise in the springtime. It's also a good time to prune existing fruit trees before the frosts arrive and rhubarb can be divided into smaller clumps and replanted ready for the new season.

Broad beans can be sown in November which will give an earlier crop for the end of next spring. Beetroot can be left in the ground and harvested in the winter to be eaten pickled, freshly cooked or cold with salads. Carrots can also be left in the ground until you are ready to use them. Hardy spring onions and salad leaves can be set for cropping in both winter and spring

There are several crops to be harvested at this time of year including winter cabbages, brussels sprouts, cauliflowers and leeks along with turnips, swedes and parsnips – all good for serving with Christmas dinner on the 25<sup>th</sup>. It's a good idea to harvest brussels sprouts before they 'blow' open and these can be frozen for use later in the year. Leeks can also be frozen and lots of information about preserving fruit and veg can be found at websites such as www.lovefoodhatewaste.com/foods-and-recipes and www.thekitchencommunity.org

but these need to be protected in a greenhouse or polytunnel.





Whether on the allotment or in the garden it's a good idea to keep an eye out for hedgehogs at this time of year as they can easily be caught in bonfires whilst looking for somewhere to hibernate.

A group of us have just returned from a pilgrimage to Israel in mid-October. It was a super time but our return was somewhat of a challenge. It was just after Hamas had started their missile attacks, resulting in several airlines suspending flights. #### **UPDATE ON PROPOSED NEW PARISH CEMETERY – AUTUMN 2023**

Dear Resident,

Since the parish council was formed in 2019, providing a new village cemetery has been a key priority for us, as the only burial ground in the village currently open to new plots, at St Peter's Church, is likely to be full within the next few years. I have been leading the parish council's efforts to provide a new village cemetery and would like to take this opportunity to update you on our progress, as we prepare to submit a planning application.

<u>Site Selection</u> As we quickly learnt, setting up a new cemetery is not as simple as you might think, and needs agreement from a number of people and organisations, each having very different requirements that we must satisfy. I'm short on space here, so I'll spare you the detail and just say that it has genuinely taken us four years to get to the stage that we are now at. This roughly comprised of 18 months of negotiating with landowners to agree on a location (held up by the pandemic), 2 years of on-site assessments, groundwater level monitoring and negotiating with the Environment Agency (with our thanks to the tenant farmer who kindly allowed us access to the land in between crops), and almost 6 months of discussions with our local planning and highways authorities, as well as others, to agree on a site layout.

The result of all this is that we have agreed on a preferred location, being a piece of farmland to the north of Chapel Road, just past Fengate Farm as you head out of the village towards Mildenhall. The site is currently owned by Suffolk County Council and farmed by a tenant, however we have an agreement with the landowner to transfer the site to WRPC for a nominal sum, subject to us receiving all the required consents. The proposed site is outlined in the aerial photograph of Chapel Road below.



<u>Cemetery Design</u> A few months ago several parish councillors toured a number of local cemeteries and spoke with cemetery groundskeepers, to help identify any design features that we would like to include in our new cemetery. Design advice was also sought and received from the Environment Agency, West Suffolk Council and Suffolk Highways. As is now required, we also had an ecologist attend the site, and they have made a number of recommendations which we will carry forward to make the site as eco-friendly as possible. We also shared and discussed our plans with the village Church and Chapel, and a local undertaker, during the design phase, and we thank them all for their help.

Some of the key parts of the proposed design, shown overleaf, include: a new road access  $\cdot$  a tarmac road  $\cdot$  2 tarmac-surface disabled spaces  $\cdot$  25 grass-surface parking spaces  $\cdot$  bicycle parking  $\cdot$  new perimeter hedge and tree planting  $\cdot$  a road within the main burial area creating 4 main burial sections  $\cdot$  room for approximately 450 burial plots  $\cdot$  a separate area for cremated remains  $\cdot$  spaces for memorial benches and trees  $\cdot$  a screened-off maintenance area  $\cdot$  pedestrian/cyclist access points linking with the existing public footpath to the east, and the new path to the north (to be provided as part of the nearby housing developments)



<u>What happens next?</u> At this stage we are focused on obtaining planning permission and it is quite possible that the design will change further during this process. If all goes well, I would like to think that we could obtain planning consent early in 2024. The exact Environment Agency requirements are likely to be established around the same time. Assuming we are successful with these efforts, we can then formally request SCC to transfer the land to us, however this is likely to take a while as the land is currently subject to an agricultural tenancy. Any waiting period can be used to obtain quotes for the construction works.

I will aim to update you all again at an appropriate point. In the meantime, should you have any feedback or queries regarding the proposed layout, or would like any further information regarding this project, please contact me via the parish clerk. (See contact details elsewhere in this Echo.)
