RAF MILDENHALL - UPDATE REPORT SEP 2020

Background

- 1. The mission of the 100th Air Refuelling Wing at RAF Mildenhall is to provide a Ready Force and Strategic Forward Base Projecting Airpower through Unrivalled Air Refuelling across Europe and Africa. The Vision is Extending Reach and deterrence through Warrior Minded Airmen.
- 2. West Row Parish Council is invited to **note**:
 - a. The 100 Air Refuelling Wing and RAF Mildenhall is Commanded by Col T Pananon.
 - b. The resident 352nd SOW is Commanded by Col William C Freeman.
 - c. The base continues to manage and respond to the COVID 19 situation.
 - d. RAF Mildenhall will remain open. The 2,500 airmen based in Mildenhall, England, who are responsible for aerial refueling and special operations, and who had been scheduled to re-base in Germany, will remain in the U.K., thus ensuring the uninterrupted readiness and responsiveness of these units.
 - e. The current RAF Cdr, Sqn Ldr Graham, will be departing RAF Mildenhall in mid Nov 2020 to commence a new assignment. His replacement will be nominated in due course.

Exercises/Operations

3. Both the 100th Air Refuelling Wing and 352nd SOW maintained essential Mission and training outputs in support to US, UK and NATO Defence Activities. During Sep the base has accommodated/supported several RAF aircraft in support to UK operations.

Wider Community Engagement

4. Due to COVID 19 the scope for Community Engagement has been reduced. A commemoration to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the Battle of Britain and mark the 73rd birthday of the USAF will be conducted on 18th Sep 20. The church service and flypast will be subject to and in compliance with COVID 19 requirements.

Matters of the Moment

- 5. **RAF Mildenhall Divestiture-Update**. 26^{th-}27th June 2020 the US Secretary of Defence Dr Mark T Esper visited RAF Mildenhall, toured the base and met personnel from across the Station. Whilst at RAF Mildenhall he also viewed facilities and examined the broad capabilities provided by the elements currently based here.
- 6. Following a US announcement on 29 July 20, on 30 July 2020 it was confirmed that RAF Mildenhall will remain open. The 2,500 airmen based in Mildenhall, United Kingdom, who are responsible for aerial refueling and special operations, and who had been scheduled to re-base in Germany, will remain in the U.K., thus ensuring the uninterrupted readiness and responsiveness of these units.

- 7. This EUCOM review includes optimizing our force presence worldwide; freeing up time, money, and manpower to invest in other areas; implementing our Immediate Response Force, Contingency Response Force, and Dynamic Force Employment enhanced readiness concepts; and, moving toward greater use of rotational forces from the United States to enhance our strategic flexibility and operational unpredictability, as we've done over the past few months with our Bomber Task Forces.
- 8. **Crime and anti-social behavior.** Base leadership and Community Relations Advisors are tracking and working with local authorities in relation to several crime and anti-social issues. These include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Speeding: The RAF Cdr has liaised with USAF, Suffolk Highways and the local constabularies regarding speeding on roads local to RAF Mildenhall. Further updates to follow.
